LOCAL RULES

STAKED TREES OR TREES LESS THAN ONE CLUB LENGTH IN HEIGHT
 If such a tree interferes with a player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the ball must be lifted without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b (Immovable Obstruction). The ball may be cleaned when so lifted.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR (Rule 25-1 applies)
 1. The tree plantations (defined by blue stakes) are ground under repair from which play is prohibited. If a player's ball lies in a plantation or if a plantation interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player must take relief as provided in Rule 25-1.
 2. In any closely mown area through the green, marks made by tractor tyres or wheels of other green keeping machinery.
 3. Any open stone filled ditch.
 4. In or against the drainage pipes in bunkers at the 9th green.
 5. Winter greens are ground under repair from which play is prohibited.
 Players must take relief as provided in Rule 25-1.
 6. Rocky Outcrops in closely mown areas.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULE
 Match play - Loss of hole
 Stroke play - Two strokes.

OUT OF BOUNDS
 1. Beyond any wall or fence bounding the course.
 2. Beyond any line of white stakes bounding the course.
 3. In or beyond the ditch bounding the practice ground on the right of the 8th hole.
 4. From the east end of the car park to the back of the practice putting green. The boundary definition shall be the edge of the grass.


FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS
 All fixed sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions and relief may be obtained under Rule 24-2. In addition, if such an obstruction or within two club-lengths of the putting green of the hole being played intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may obtain relief, without penalty, as follows: If the ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and is within two club-lengths of the intervening obstruction, it may be lifted, cleaned and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay which a) is not nearer the hole, b) avoids such intervention and c) is not in a hazard or on a putting green.

INTEGRAL PART OF THE COURSE
 The internal wall between the 12th and 13th holes.

STONES IN BUNKERS (Rule 24-1)
 Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions.
